SIS10 Sport and Recreation Training Package Update

Dear Industry Stakeholder,

Many of you will be aware that there has been significant changes in the architecture of the Vocational Education Training (VET) sector in the last 12 months. SkillsIQ is the Skills Service Organisation (SSO) responsible for supporting the Sport and Recreation Industry Reference Committee (IRC) to undertake training package development to ensure skills meet future industry needs.

Under this new model SSO's, on behalf of the relevant IRC, are required to develop a business case which presents an industry rationale for training package review. SkillsIQ has been issued with an activity order to prepare a business case detailing the work required to review the Outdoor Recreation training package.

At a Sport and Recreation IRC meeting in Sydney on the 22nd August, SkillsIQ presented the Sport and Recreation Business Case - Project Proposal. I am pleased to announce that the IRC accepted the proposal and we are now in a position to form an Outdoor Recreation Technical Advisory Committee (O Rec TAC). The primary role of the O Rec TAC is to provide industry specific guidance and input into the development of the business case. The O Rec TAC will be formed and operate in accordance with the attached Outdoor Recreation TAC Terms of Reference. (attached to this letter)

The Chair of the IRC has approved the Outdoor Council of Australia's representative on the IRC, Charlie Cross as the Chair of the O Rec TAC. Charlie will work with Skills IQ to confirm the O Rec TAC by September 24.

On behalf of the Sport and Recreation IRC and Skills IQ, I am pleased to invite **Expressions of Interest** for membership of the **Outdoor Recreation Technical Advisory Committee**. Please forward EOI (form attached) to liz.horne@skillsiq.com.au by **September 16, 2016**.

The O Rec TAC will begin their work at a face to face meeting in Sydney on Tuesday October 4. The TAC will have the opportunity to provide guidance and direction in relation to previous industry intelligence and feedback, review previous training package directions, provide new or emerging industry based feedback or intelligence and then continue the conversation to provide direction and evidence to support that a full review is required at this time.
